Students Stopping Rape Coordinator

**Now available for those dedicated to gender equality
and a community free of sexual violence.**

The Coordinator is responsible for leading the student group. This includes but is not limited to: planning and facilitating the weekly meetings; helping to plan and lead the Fall Quarter training; scheduling students for presentations, often in conjunction with the Res Hall Programming Intern or Men Against Rape Coordinators; and disseminating information to the group members, such as meeting reminders, meeting notes, assignment reminders as well as relevant current information about sexual violence.

The Coordinator is also responsible for leading recruitment of students for the group, writing reports of group activities and working with the Media Intern on publicity of group events and programs. Develop new educational campaigns and/or organize the existing campaigns – I Want a Truce and It Affects Me.

The Students Stopping Rape Coordinator is a member of the RPEP internship program. Interns meet on a regular basis twice a month with occasional extra meetings. Interns work together to fulfill the goals of the Rape Prevention Education Program.

The Rape Prevention Education Program (RPEP) provides education and information about sexual assault, dating and domestic violence, and stalking. Programs, lectures, discussions and written materials explain laws and definitions, suggest strategies to increase safety, and dispel the common myths about sexual violence. The RPEP also provides assistance for survivors of sexual violence and their families and friends. Assistance includes crisis counseling, information about reporting, help with legal and medical questions and campus judicial procedures, help with academic and housing problems, and referrals to other campus and community resources.
