

Rape Prevention Education Program - RPEP Internships for 2006-07

**Now available for those dedicated to gender equality
and a community free of sexual violence.**

Media Outreach. Write and submit articles on issues of sexual violence as well as responding to articles that appear in the Daily Nexus. Use all campus media outlets, including radio and TV to educate in addition to creating new educational methods.

Residence Halls Programmer. Develop, advertise and maintain informational/bulletin board programs. Work with on and off campus residence halls to fulfill building-wide programs and passive requests. Use and create other means to educate students on the issues of sexual violence.

Webmaster. Maintain, add and create informational pages for Students Stopping Rape Website. Research and edit information on sexual violence for websites. Web experience required.

Outreach to Student Groups of Color. Outreach and collaborate with the student groups on campus that are primarily students of color to develop educational approaches for preventing sexual violence within their groups or communities and to invite collaboration with Students Stopping Rape and Men Against Rape in campus-wide educational campaigns.

Men Against Rape Outreach. The intern would be responsible for inviting male-oriented groups on campus, as well as individual men, to collaborate with and/or get involved in MAR to develop projects designed for men that recognize the role men have in combating sexual violence.

Students Stopping Rape Coordinator. Lead the student group, which includes: plan and facilitate weekly meetings; help plan and lead Fall Quarter training; schedule students for presentations, often in conjunction with the Res Hall Programming Intern or Men Against Rape Coordinator; and, disseminate information to the group members, such as meeting and assignment reminders, meeting notes, and relevant current information about sexual violence.

Men Against Rape Coordinator. Lead the student group, which includes: plan and facilitate weekly meetings; schedule students for presentations, often in conjunction with the Res Hall Programming Intern or Students Stopping Rape Coordinator; and, disseminate information to the group members.
