Outreach to Student Groups of Color

The purpose of this internship is to outreach and collaborate with the student groups on campus that are primarily students of color. The goal is to work with those students to develop educational approaches for preventing sexual violence within their groups or communities and to invite collaboration with Students Stopping Rape and Men Against Rape in campus-wide educational campaigns. The intern would also ensure that these groups are aware of the resources available on campus and in the community.

The primary objective is to organize projects that recognize the cultural challenges and barriers to open discussion of topics that have traditionally been left unspoken. Through thoughtful programming and culturally sensitive delivery, this intern will further the objective of educating our students of color campus community on the issues of sexual violence prevention.

The Rape Prevention Education Program (RPEP) provides education and information about sexual assault, dating and domestic violence, and stalking. Programs, lectures, discussions and written materials explain laws and definitions, suggest strategies to increase safety, and dispel the common myths about sexual violence. The RPEP also provides assistance for survivors of sexual violence and their families and friends. Assistance includes crisis counseling, information about reporting, help with legal and medical questions and campus judicial procedures, help with academic and housing problems, and referrals to other campus and community resources.
